From Chairman's Desk



Dear Colleagues,

It gives immense pleasure to share with you that Cochin Port could achieve the sixth position among the Major Ports in the evaluation of Individual Port Performance for the year 2015-16 carried out for the purpose of Productivity Linked Reward (PLR). In spite of our financial constraints, Port management is committed to pay PLR I to CoPT staff and pensioners in a time bound manner, i.e., 15th November and 15th December, 2016.

We are able to achieve a traffic growth of 6.6% during the April-October 2016 period with an appreciable 20% growth in the container handling.

The arrival of coastal car carrier brings new hopes to the Port and we are looking forward to more vibrant port activities on Willingdon Island.

Increase in crude oil handling and POL due to BPCL Refinery expansion will give further fillip to our growth.

Govt. of India was very considerable to Cochin Port Trust and had waived Rs.897.23 crores of penal interest.

Recently, we have got favourable arbitration award from Ministry of Law on the issue relating to payment of transfer fee by BPCL Kochi Refinery. Cochin Port Trust is exploring and trying to tap further coastal cargo and also strategic tie-

up with Coast Guard for improving port revenue.

Committed initiatives by Govt. of Kerala are yielding results and the bottlenecks to laying of pipelines by GAIL are being cleared on war footing. Once the pipeline network is ready, the LNG terminal at Puthuvypin will operate to its full capacity, ensuring higher revenue to the Port.

I thank the labour unions in the Port for ensuring strike-free functioning of the Port, which helped a lot in gaining credibility among the trade in Kerala as well as in the hinterland in Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.

Let us strive hard to achieve higher goals in the coming days to take our port to its past glory.

TRAFFIC GROWTH

ochin Port, as in the previous years, ✓ has registered significant growth in the current year also. Last year Port has registered a growth of 2.33%. This year till 31st October 2016 Port has shown a growth of 6.63%, when compared to 31st October 2015. Majority of growth has occurred in containers and liquid bulk cargo. Also regarding performance of the Port, it is showing significant improvement in various performance parameters.

Regarding International Container Transshipment Terminal (ICTT), this year 31stOctober 2016 a total of 2, 83,114 TEUs has been handled as against 2.36.096 TEUs in the correspondence period of previous year. This is 19.91% increase over the previous year. It is expected that this year ICTT may touch the ambitious figure of 5 lakh TEUs as per the current trend.

One of the major achievements of this vear is the start of new Ro-Ro Car Carrier

calling at Cochin Port for import of coastal cars. It is for the first time such an initiatives has happened in Cochin Port. It is expected that there will be regular call of Ro-Ro ships carrying car to Cochin in future. Inorder to promote this, as per the directive of Ministry, Port has extended 80% discount in Vessel Related Charges and Cargo Related Charges for Ro-Ro ships.

This year the season for the cruise ship has begun and the first ship M. V Emerald Princess was handled on 22.10.2016. It is expected that about 49 cruise ships will be handled this year. Port has decided to permit temporary souvenir stall at the berth for display and sale of ethnic Indian products like handicrafts and curios. About 30-35 stalls are operating currently.

This year it is expected that Port will achieve its target throughput of 24.5 Million Tones.

Waiver of penal interest on Gol loans

he Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has given its approval for waiver of penal interest on Government of India (GOI) loans availed by Cochin Port Trust to the tune of Rs. 897.23 crore. The CCEA also gave its approval by freezing the liability on account of GOI loans, interest thereon and penal interest @ 0.25% as on 31.3.2016 amounting to Rs.557.16 crore (Rs.258.14 crore + Rs.281.45 crore + Rs.17.57 crore). The CCEA, further approved the rescheduling of repayment of the amount frozen in 10 vears commencing from 2018-19.

The Cochin Port Trust availed loans for various developmental activities from Govt. of India amounting to Rs.168.15 crore between1936-37 to 1994-95. Nonrepayment of these loans has attracted penal interest to the tune of Rs. 914.80 crore. The Port could not repay the loans since the projected revenue from the capital investment done was not sufficient to cover the interest component.

The move comes in the backdrop of a series of steps taken by Cochin Port. The Cochin Port has undertaken a series of remedial measures to improve its financial conditions, apart from the measures ordered by Government of India, such as ban on recruitments, stoppage of vehicle purchases and the like, measures adopted by the Port include steps unprecedented in other Major Ports, like freezing of Variable DA for all employees and Dearness Relief for pensioners, stoppage of HBA, conveyance advance, and LTC, stoppage of overtime posting for non-operating areas, reduction of uniform allowance to single set basis, and deferment of Leave Encashment.

With these recent initiatives taken by the Cochin Port, several income streams, long awaited by the Port, are now beginning to bear fruit and this would improve the financial status of the Port in future.
