Dr. M. Beena IAS assumes charge as Chairman

Dr. M. Beena IAS has assumed the charge as Chairman, Cochin Port Trust on 04.10.2018.

A native of Trivandrum, Dr. Beena is a medical doctor by profession and got into Indian Administrative Services from Kerala Cadre in the year 1999. She has served in various capacities in the State including Assistant Collector, Sub Collector and Director of various Departments. She has also served as District Collector of Thrissur and Ernakulam.

She was the managing director, KSIDC and CEO, Smart City Thiruvananthapuram prior to joining Cochin Port Trust. She was also the Managing Director to the Roads & Bridges Development Corporation, Vyttila Mobility Hub, Kerala Books & Publications Ltd and Food & SUPPLYCO.

During her service period of 18 years, she had multifaceted experience in various sectors like infrastructure development, transportation, industrial development, airport cargo handling, financial service etc.



As District Collector, Ernakulam, she has also been closely associated with the activities of Cochin Port especially during the construction of International Container Transshipment Terminal (ICTT). She also associated with many prestigious projects like commissioning of Petronet LNG, phase 2 expansion of BPCL, laying of GAIL pipeline etc. Under leadership of Dr M Beena IAS KSIDC achieved highest recorded profit in the year 2015-16.

Contribution to Chief Minister's Relief Fund

Shri A.V.Ramana, Deputy Chairman, Cochin Port Trust handed over cheque for an amount of Rs.62,69,326/

DMICDC Logistics Data Services extends operations to Cochin Port

Expanding its operations in India's South-Eastern corridor, the digital container tracking solution of DMICDC Logistics Data Services (DLDS) brought in its ambit Cochin Port, an initiative that would streamline the container logistics operations at one of the largest and busiest ports of India on the Arabian Sea.

Logistics Data Bank (LDB), the single window tracking solution that has hugely improved operations in Indian container logistics, launched its services at the ports of Chennai, Visakhapatnam and Krishnapatnam from 01.11.2018.

Mr. Alkesh K Sharma, CEO and Managing Director, DMICDC, Dr. M. Beena, Chairperson, Cochin Port Trust, Mr. Surajit Sarkar, COO, DLDS; Mr. Praveen Thomas Joseph, CEO, ICTT DPW Cochin, Mr. Ichiro Oshima, AVP, NEC Technologies India and senior officials of Cochin Port, DP World, Steamer Agents' Association and Custom Brokers' Association were present during the function.



"The launch of LDB operations at the Cochin Port, one of the largest in the country, is going to create visibility and transparency in the way operations happen. All the stakeholders in the supply chain operations will benefit with such an initiative," Mr. Alkesh Sharma said, adding, "We are going to make it operational in all other major ports in the country."

LDB, which currently handles 70 per cent of India's container tracking began its operations in the Western corridor, at the Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT), and extended its container tracking services to Hazira and Mundra ports of Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone (APSEZ). The extension of LDB's services to India's southern corridor follows a milestone of 10 million EXIM containers tracked by its single window interface.

Dr. Beena said the container tracking services would greatly boost efficiency among supply chain operations through advanced ICT technologies. "Cochin Port is one of the busiest ports in the country and the introduction of LDB operations will bring in more efficiency within the process of exporting or importing shipment of goods and would thus benefit the stakeholders in the supply chain logistics down the line," she noted.

Widely known as a game-changing technology for the Indian logistics sector, LDB's container tracking solution has turned out to be a boon for businesses in India, reducing the port dwell time and the overall transportation time for export and import shipments.



Inauguration of free Wi-Fi facility for cruise passengers



Free Wi-Fi facility for cruise passengers has been started at the Cruise Terminal 'Samudrika' of Cochin Port from 25.10.2018 with the support from Kerala IT Mission.

Dr. M. Beena, IAS, Chairperson, Cochin Port Trust launched the facility in the presence of HODs of CoPT, Shipping Agents and other Senior Officials of Immigration Departments of the Port. Port. With this 'Samudrika' became the first Cruise Terminal in India to have free Wi-Fi facility.



First ship at Penna Cement Terminal

'Penna Suraksha' – the first vessel carrying 25,000 tonnes of cement arrived at Q6 Berth of Ernakulam Wharf of Cochin Port on 03.08.2018. Cement brought from Krishnapatnam Port was transferred from the ship to the silos located at the Penna Cement terminal near Ernakulam Wharf through pneumatic suction. This modal shift in transport of cement from road/rail to shipping is another step towards promoting coastal shipping through cost-effective & environment-friendly logistics envisaged under the Sagarmala programme of Ministry of Shipping. Cement being a high-volume low-value product, low-cost sea transport is very important as a game changer in logistics. The National Perspective Plan lists coastal movement of cement as an important segment of India's coastal shipping potential. Shri. A.V. Ramana, Chairman (i/c) and Shri. Goutam Gupta, Traffic Manager, Cochin Port Trust witnessed handling of the first consignment to the terminal at Ernakulam Wharf. Shri. Santhosh Antony, Unit Head, Penna Cement Industries Ltd, Shri. D.Lakshmikantham, Director (Technical), Penna Cement, Capt. Y.D. Misra, Head of Operations, Penna Shipping Ltd. and Capt. S. Shinde, Master of Vessel, Penna Suraksha were also present. The bagging terminal of Penna Cement Ltd. is the fourth such terminal in Cochin Port. The terminal set up in 1.14 ha of land leased by Cochin Port is



expected to handle 3 lakh tonnes of cement annually. Presently, three Cement Terminals (Ambuja, UltraTech and Zuari) are in operation. Malabar Cements, a Govt. of Kerala Co. has also been allotted land at Cochin Port setting up a bagging terminal. The three currently operational terminals handle 7,83,000 tonnes of cement annually and a throughput of 1.5 MMT is expected by 2020. The current annual sales volume of Penna Cement for the whole of India is 5.80 MMT of which 0.30 MMT is in Kerala, which is confined to North Kerala. The Cochin packing terminal will be catering to the requirements of central and South Kerala, which is



Coastal Rice Consignment of Food Corporation of India arrived

Government of India had embarked upon a port-led development project called Sagarmala, which is the flagship programme of the Ministry of Shipping to promote coastal shipping through harnessing India's 7,500 km long coastline, 14,500 km of potentially navigable waterways and the ports. As part of the programme, the initiative and sustained efforts of the marketing team under Traffic Department of Cochin Port to promote coastal shipping gave yet another positive result when a consignment of 4,732 Metric tonnes of rice in 182 containers arrived ICTT Vallarpadam of Cochin Port on 10.11.2018 in a container ship named SSL Kochi. The consignment of rice is on account of Food Corporation of India (FCI) for public distribution in Kerala, shipped from Kakinara Port and arrived Cochin via Krishnapatnam. Until recently, FCI was bringing rice predominantly by rail and this is a modal shift to coastal shipping as the same proved cost effective for FCI. It is expected that 10,000 tonnes of rice per month will come from Andhra Pradesh to Kerala in the days to come. On this occasion, Dr. M. Beena IAS, Chairperson of Cochin Port thanked FCI and the carrier M/s. Avana Logistek Ltd for making it happen. She said that efforts are on to bring wheat a/c FCI from Punjab/Haryana to Kerala using coastal shipping, which apart from giving additional volume to the Port will be cost effective for the public distribution giant.

Cochin Port Trust is developing a 2.1 KM backwater side Walkway, as a beautiful public space for Cochin City on one side of National Highway NH 966B in W/Island. However the other side of the road as well as nearby roadsides is spoiled by miscreants by throwing garbage. National Highway and its sides being maintained by NH Division of Kerala State PWD, the Port is not in a position to clean it regularly. Hence as a onetime measure, Cochin Port Trust cleared the garbage dumped by miscreants on the sides of 3 kms long NH stretch on Willingdon Island from CIFT Junction to Alexander Parambithara Bridge during the campaign period. 30 lorry loads of garbages were shifted to Brahmapuram Waste Treatment Plant.
